Subject:- Grant of conditional permission to Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0251) with intake capacity of 52 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 04 seats ii) Shalya tantra - 04 seats iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan - 04 seats iv) Kayachikitsa - 05 seats for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulation thereunder regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0251)** visitation of your College was conducted on **05.02.2024** and **06.02.2024** and visited again on **18.03.2024** and **19.03.2024** on **Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **Conditional permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 04 seats ii) Shalya Tantra - 04 seats iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan - 04 seats iv) Kayachikitsa - 05 seats for the academic session 2024-25, under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
2. Further, the college denied to conduct the re-visit and Medical Assessment & Rating Board, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine was in a receipt of a letter **vide ref. no. C-80/SGM/AY/2024-25 dated 19.03.2024** wherein the college mentioned that **"due to death of our General Secretary of the college Management; all the teacher had been directed to attend the funeral of the general secretary of their trust."**
3. Furthermore, the hearing with regard to faculty suspected to be working only on paper but physically not present was conducted on **12.07.2024** and recommendation of the hearing committee was placed in the **98th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 19.07.2024**. The same was approved that **two of your faculty** who were suspected to be working only on paper, namely **Dr. Shivangi Das (AYKS00280)** and **Dr. Hari Krishna Chinnaraju (AYKC02230)** cannot be considered as regular teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter ref. no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2024 **dated 30.07.2024** and **monetary penalty of rupees 50 Lakh was imposed on the college.**
4. Further, Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCSIM was in receipt of a **letter vide ref no. SSAMCH/24/11 dated 20.08.2024** regarding the payment of imposed monetary penalty of **Rs. 50 Lakh** to your college in installments and same was placed in the **103rd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCSIM **held on 21.08.2024 & 22.08.2024**. **Board accepted the request of the college to pay the monetary penalty of Rs. 50 lakh in installments and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 30.08.2024.**
5. Further, **Denial of Conditional Permission for the academic session 2024-25 was issued to the college** vide letter of even no. **dated 03.09.2024** due to the following reasons: -
 - a) The college denied the re-visit scheduled on 18th and 19th March 2024 **saying that, "due to death of our General Secretary of the college Management. All the teacher had been directed to attend the funeral of the general secretary of their trust."** Further, the hearing committee observed that the denial of visitation of apex regulatory body and also the submission made by the college is not justified.

- b) Also, It is to note that there is no provision in the rules to deny the visitation. **Hence, the hearing committee came to a conclusion that the submissions made by the college cannot be considered.**
- c) Further, It is pertinent to mention here that **as per section 28(1) (c) of NCISM Act, 2020**, Medical Assessment and Rating Board can carry out inspections for assessing and rating of institutions by any third-party agency or persons authorized by Medical Assessment & Rating Board, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine and it shall be obligatory on such institutions to provide access to such agency for person. Further, **as per section 29(7) of NCISM Act, 2020**, Medical Assessment & Rating Board, National Commission for Indian System of Medicine can conduct assessment of any institute at any time without prior notice. **Therefore, it is considered that if the college does not allow the visitors to execute their assignment, the college is not following the NCISM Act, 2020.**
6. **Thereafter, the college has filed a first appeal in the Commission which was later dismissed by the Commission vide ref. no. NCISM/Comm/OPT Appeal/ (2024-25)-(U.P) dated 16.10.2024.** Further, the college has filed a second appeal to the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India, New Delhi and Government of India, Ministry of AYUSH, New Delhi has dismissed the appeal vide letter ref. no. L-14014/18/2024- EP-I dated 19.11.2024.
7. Aggrieved by the same, the college challenged the **denial order dated 03.09.2024** issued by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board and **dismissal of 1st appeal order issued by the Commission dated 16.10.2024 & dismissal of 2nd appeal order issued by the Ministry of AYUSH, Government of India dated 19.11.2024 for the academic year 2024-25** before the **Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, Lucknow Bench in W.P. (C) No. 10202 of 2024 and the Honourable court vide its order dated 04.12.2024**, quashed the denial order dated 03.09.2024, 16.10.2024 and 19.11.2024 and directed the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to conduct a fresh surprise inspection of the petitioner college and to pass a fresh order.
8. Accordingly, in compliance of court order vide **W.P. (C) No. 10202 of 2024**, a fresh visitation was conducted by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0251) on 09.12.2024 and 10.12.2024 through hybrid mode.**
9. Thereafter, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022; "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified and approved criteria due to the following shortcomings :-**

10. In view of above, On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, **an opportunity of virtual hearing** was provided to your college vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even number** dated **13.12.2024** to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on **14.12.2024**, to present the case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to the college with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 04 seats, ii) Shalya Tantra – 04 seats, iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan – 04 seats iv) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2024-25.**
11. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter no. C-255/SGMPG/2024-25, dated 13.12.2024** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Prof. Ajay Chaturvedi principal of the college and Dr. Rajiv Kumar Rai, Vice Principal of the college**, appeared before the Hearing Committee on **14.12.2024** and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

(1.3) Agad Tantra & Vidhi Vaidyak- In this department during first visitation Dr. Snehal Dinkar Gajbhiye teacher code AYAT00744, Asst. Professor was present but there after she relieved through portal. We appointed to fill this post namely Dr. Chandrika Amod Kulkarni as associate professor (AYAT00686) on 09.12.2024 and verified the visitors.

(1.4) Prasuti & Stri Roga:- We have two lower faculty in this department namely Dr. Sheela Gupta (Teacher Code-AYPS01341) working since 14.06.2022 to till date and another Dr. Pramod Singh (AYPS 01595) are working since 20.12.2023 to till date.

(1.5) Kaumarbharitya-Bala Roga:- Sir, in this department Dr. Pramod Kumar Gupta is already appointed and verified by NCISM as Assistant Professor (Teacher Code-AYKB01067) since 01.01.2024 and working till date. He was present and verified in all visitations by NCISM/and by visitors.

(1.6) Kayachikitsa:- In this department there are two Higher Faculty as Professor namely Prof. Ajay Chaturvedi (Teacher Code- AYKC03120) working since 01.02.2014 and another Prof. Vijay Seth

working as professor in the department of Roga Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan since 21/04/23. He was physically present in both the visitations but his OTMS is not yet updated. As per the principal the faculty has mailed multiple times to update his OTMS profile regarding his appointment in the present college.

Submission may be considered.

(1.3) Agad Tantra & Vidhi Vaidyak- As told by the principal Dr. Snehal Dinkar Gajbhiye (teacher code AYAT00744) was appointed and joined as Assistant Professor in the department of Agad Tantra & Vidhi Vaidyak on 11/12/24 after the last visitation (09/12/24-10/12/24). She was not present on the day of hearing.

Submission may be considered.

(b) Dr. Chandrika Amod Kulkarni (teacher code AYDG01288- Corrected one) is appointed and joined as Associate Professor in the department of Agad Tantra & Vidhi Vaidyak on 09/12/24 but she is PG in Dravyaguna subject and also her previous experience in Dravyaguna department. As she has joined in Allied subjects. So cannot be considered.

(1.4) Prasuti & Stri Roga:-

(2) Roga Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan Prof. Rajiv Kumar Rai (Teacher code-AYKC01871) working as professor in the department of Roga Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan since 21/04/23. He was physically present in the both visitation but his OTMS is not yet updated. As per told by the principal the faculty has mailed multiple times to update his OTMS profile regarding his appointment in present college.

Submission may be considered.

(3) Functionality of the Hospital:-

Respectfully it is to inform you that our Ayurvedic Hospital of the undersigned was acquired by the District Administration Ghazipur on 16.04.2021 as per order of the Government of Uttar Pradesh During the Corona transition period. After the end of the corona transition, I have tried for release of our hospital on repeated written request from the District Administration as well as Chief Medical Officer, Ghazipur. The Nodal Officer Corona Control Unit, Ghazipur has taken back all its goods and equipment and released the hospital and handed it over to the undersigned on 18.07.2023 (released order is enclosed). I had sent this written information to you at that time (copy enclosed).

Immediately after taken back our hospital, entire hospital building was cleaned and sanitized and its regular functions was started. The patient attendance has increased day by day after publicity among the community and now become as per the standard of MSR.

Conclusion:- As the hospital was acquired by the District Administration, Ghazipur as per order of Government of Uttar Pradesh as the Covid-19 L-2 Centre hospital during corona

(3) Functionality of the Hospital:- College submitted released order from superintendent of PHC krandagazipur regarding release and handover of the hospital and equipment Entire hospital building was cleaned and sanitized, that's why regular functioning of the hospital was delayed. The hospital was handover on 18.07.23. The total no. Of patient attended OPD. Average attendance of patient of patient in OPD and average bed occupancy is to be calculated from 18.07.23 to 31.12.2023 accordingly.

- Average attendance of patient in OPD per day from 19.07.2023 to 31.12.2023 is **125.84**.
- Bed occupancy

Submission may be considered.
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12. The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022; "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and it was observed that the **college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the academic Session 2024-25.**
13. However, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), **decided to issue Conditional Permission for the UG (BAMS) course as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28(1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020** for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the academic year 2024-25, and the **decision shall subject to ratification in the ensuing Board Meeting of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM).**

As per the seat reduction policy:-

- a. **"For every 1% deficiency in Bed occupancy, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat."**

As per sub-regulation 14 of Regulation 6 of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, the post-graduate institute where under-graduate course is in existence shall have , ***" The minimum annual average bed-occupancy in In-Patient Department of the hospital during last one calendar year (i.e. 365 days and 366 days in case of a leap year) shall be more than fifty per cent"***

Further, availability of Average Bed occupancy after considering the submissions made by the college is 41.66 % and there is a Shortcoming of 08.34 % in Average Bed Occupancy against the minimum requirement of 50 % as per the aforementioned Regulation. **Therefore, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake seat strength by eight seats.**

Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of Conditional Permission with 52 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

14. **Further, a letter vides ref. no. -258/SGM/PG/Ay./Monetary Penalty/2024-25 dated 14.12.2024 has been received in the MARBISM, NCISM regarding payment of the 1st installment of Rs. 25 Lakh through RTGS no. UBINR22024121301200483 dated 13.01.2024 which has been verified.**
15. Therefore, in view of the above, conditional permission is granted to **Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0251) with intake capacity of 52 seats (instead of 60 seats) in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 04 seats, ii) Shalya tantra – 04 seats, iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan – 04 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020.**
- (i) The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- (ii) It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 52 seats [instead of 60 seats] and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 17 seats in 04 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

(iii) It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.

16. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
17. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
18. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
19. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be submitted to the MARB-ISM, in order to be considered for the grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2025-2026:**
 - (i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
 - (ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - (iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - (iv) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for postgraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024;
 - (v) The shortcoming mentioned in Point no.11 above.
20. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
21. **The issued conditional permission is subject to ratification in the ensuing Board meeting.**
