Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0251) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 04 seats, ii) Shalya tantra – 04 seats, iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan – 04 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats, for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0251)** inspection was conducted on **08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 04 seats, ii) Shalya tantra – 04 seats, iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan – 04 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**
- 2) Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 and Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation port, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings:-**

a. Teaching staffs:-

Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{29}{30} \times 100\% = 96.66\%$ (Including Visitors observation and Excluding Excess)

b. AEBAS :-

- It was observed that attendance percentage of all the teaching faculty members is zero except 2 which is against the minimum required attendance percentage of 65% till day of visitation.
- Further the Board issued a show cause vide ref **3-4/U.P/MARB/2025-Ay (11)** dated 08.05.2025.
- It is submitted that the Board is in receipt of a clarification from **Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0251)** vide ref no **C-139/SGMPG/2025-26** dated 16.05.2025.

On verification of compliance received with regards to AEBAS showcase : - **college register 40 faculties in the AEBAS but no one is marking attendance on the AEBAS.**

- Thereafter, the assessment report was placed in the **134th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 16.07.2025. Board decided and decided to grant an opportunity of clarification.
- Thereafter, the assessment report along with clarification was placed in the **139th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 06.08.2025. Board decided and decided to again grant an opportunity of clarification.
- The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the **142nd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **21.08.2025** and **On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of physical hearing vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of even number dated 28.08.2025 to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on 01.09.2025, to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 04 seats, ii) Shalyatantra – 04 seats, iii) Rog Nidanavum Vikriti Vigyan – 04 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2025-26.**
- The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. **C-250/SGM/Ay./2025-26, dated 30.08.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them.** Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Rajiv Kr Rai, Vice Principal, Mr. A. K. Trivedi, Member management committee of the college,** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **01.09.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Records and reports of action taken as per standard protocols (information to Fire department & Electricity department etc.) with supportive original documents.	We are asked to submit our clarification with records and reports of action taken as per standard protocols (information to fire department and electricity department etc.) with supportive original documents regarding the same to the board. In connection with the above issue we would like to clarify that on 14.07.2025 one of our room/hall at Sham-e-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College, where the AEBAS system, DVR of CCTV cameras and led were installed caught fire due the short circuit in electric cables. As we came to know regarding the incident, immediately along with 4-5 of our employees, we started our efforts to control over the fire with the help of the fire extinguishers. Having done continuous efforts of 10 to 15 minutes, we could overcome with the situation but within the time few of our instruments like led system, biometric attendance machine and DVR etc. were destroyed. Out of the chaos we forget to intimate fire department as we thought that fire could be controlled as we were having enough number of fire extinguishers. Apart, the distance of fire office from our college is more than 20 km (1:00- hour at least to approach the College) Hence there was no scope of doing so. But to avoid any unpleasant situation (as 4-5 of our employees were engaged in the drill to control the fire) we decided to inform local police station & next day sent a person to inform the same in writing (copy of the receipt is attached as Annexure-I). Due to short circuit the electricity of entire campus got disconnected/disturbed therefore on the very same day we had initiated a complaint in the concerned electricity office as to rectify the fault as soon as possible (proof attached as Annexure-II and III). Also, a copy of the coverage of the same news in a local newspaper is attached herewith as Annexure-IV and V. The notarized affidavit submitted by the Managing Director of the College Management Committee regarding the truth of the abovementioned incident is also enclosed in original as Annexure-VI.	College produced several proofs that they informed NCISM officials 27.06.2025 & prescribed vendors in due time. At the time of visitation, as per the statement of college officials present in the hearing, visitors also verified the installation of AEBAS machine and its fault as well. On the day of visitation 39 out of 42 teachers were present verified by attendance registers signed by visitors submitted by college. About the fire incidence, college officials produced several proofs i.e. fire incidence photographs and fire related news published in newspapers, receiving copy of police information, receiving copy of electrical department. College did not inform about this to NCISM immediately. A notarized affidavit regarding this incidence has also been submitted. On asking, college has produced on e-mail, the GST bill of firefighting equipments of dated 18.08.2025 03 days after fire incidence. College has also submitted the AEBAS attendance of 47 teachers of august 2025 among them 02 teachers Dr. Vijay Kr Gupta & Dr. Surendra Kr Mishra are not working attendance on AEBAS. After examining above documents submitted by the college, it may be considered that the fire incidence was real. Submission of college may be considered.

7) Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and the assessment report was duly placed before the 145th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 02.09.2025 and Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the concerned acts and regulation but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letters issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Further, the Board also observed that the college is not fulfilling the criteria for extended permission in accordance with regulation 54(2) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024, as Conditional Permission with seat reduction was issued to the college, for the academic year 2024-25. Accordingly, the Board decided as follows:

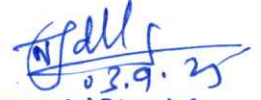
- a) To issue Yearly Permission in UG (BAMS) course with 60 seats in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.
- b) To issue for Yearly Permission with 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 04 seats, ii) Shalya tantra – 04 seats, iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan – 04 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats in accordance with Regulation 45 (3) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations 2024, as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

- 8) Therefore Sham-E-Ghausia Minority Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, At/P.O-Saheri, Via Nandganj Dist. Ghazipur -233302, Uttar Pradesh (AYU0251) is hereby granted with:-
- a) Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges 2024 and;
 - b) Yearly Permission with intake capacity of 17 seats in 04 PG courses in the subjects namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 04 seats, ii) Shalya tantra – 04 seats, iii) Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan – 04 seats, iv) Kayachikitsa – 05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 in accordance with Regulation 45(3) of NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulation, 2024;
- 9) The aforementioned decision is issued under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that following requirements shall be fulfilled:-
- I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 17 seats in 04 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
 - II. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 10) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 11) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 12) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 13) You are hereby instructed to comply with all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.
- 14) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - v) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 2 above, shall be fulfilled.

- 15) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
